English Test Information

Who needs it?

- All students who are not currently studying in English need to write the English Test.

May I request an exemption?

- Yes, if you fall under one of the following categories you may request an exemption by checking the box on the other side and supplying the requested documents.
 - Studied in an English institution for at least a year in a regular program - grade 6 and up (copy of your latest report card from that school)
 - Come from an English background (along with a copy of your report cards, write a letter explaining/outlining your situation)
 - Taken or are presently registered in a Secondary IV or V *English Language Arts* course with English grades of 80 and over [please attach copies of your latest provincial results (MELS) and Secondary IV and V school report cards - highlight your English grades]

How much is it?

- The fee for writing the English Test is \$30 (this is in addition to the \$30 Application Fee).

Where and when is it?

- The English Test is written at the college (790 Nérée-Tremblay, Québec).
- The English Test can be written on one of following dates at the time specified (please complete and send us your form to reserve your spot):
 - Saturday, February 6, 2016 at 1:00 p.m. in Room 348
 - Wednesday, February 10, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. in Room 348

How long does it take?

- You should schedule yourself to be here for an hour and a half.
- Note that if you are applying in the Arts, Literature and Communication Program (500.L1) you may also be asked to complete a **Language Survey**

How do I register?

- You can register by completing and returning the English Test Registration Form found on the other side of this sheet and returning it along with your \$30 payment.

How am I evaluated?

- You will be evaluated on your English Test results as well as your high school results (*Relevé des apprentissages* from last year and your Secondary V results to date).

What grade to I need to pass?

- There is no passing grade as such as various factors are taken into consideration. Some students may be accepted with the understanding that they follow an English course during the summer.
